To whom it may concern

I am writing to ask about the cva eclipse and the problem I had with it. I have had this rifle for about 3 years and have had no problem until this past Sunday(10-3-04) while I was sighting in a new scope. I had it bore sighted and then I shot it once everything was fine,loaded it again and the breech plug stripped out of the threads causing the bolt to break in half where the cocking handle goes through it, and the spring retaining piece to come back and hit me in the face. I am writing to see if you know what might have caused this to happen

I now have a cracked orbital bone a broken sinus bone a broken nose and 45 stitches in my nose from a torn nostril.

I have been shooting the same load in this rifle since I got it and have had no problems until now the load is 100 grains of triple seven pushing a 240 grain tc cheap shot sabot this is very accurate load and well below the maximum load for the rifle as I understand it

but for some reason this thing just came unglued and I was wondering why this would happen ? And before you ask YES the ball was seated tight to the powder. I will be waiting for your response
